Sir,

I have the honour to inform you that the International Atomic Energy Agency plans to hold an Advisory Group meeting on Safety Assessment for Underground Disposal of Radioactive Waste, preferably from 8–12 October 1979. The objective of the meeting will be to discuss and prepare a revised draft document on “Objectives, Principles and Safety Assessment Methods for the Underground Disposal of Radioactive Waste”, which will form part of the Agency’s programme to develop guidelines in the field of underground waste disposal. Approximately 20–25 experts from Member States are expected to attend the meeting.

I also have the honour to enquire whether your Government would be interested to host the meeting in question, in which event your Government would be expected to agree to the following terms concerning the meeting, which are common to all meetings held away from the Headquarters of the Agency.

1) The Government of the Kingdom of the Netherlands shall accord to the Agency its property, to the officials of the Agency and participants officially designated to attend the meeting in their official capacities, and to members of the immediate families of such persons,

the privileges and immunities provided by the Agreement on the Privileges and Immunities of the IAEA which was accepted by the Government on 29 August 1963.

2) The Government of the Kingdom of the Netherlands shall accord to officials and participants mentioned above every facility necessary to the performance of their functions in connection with the meeting, including the right to enter, remain in and leave the Kingdom of the Netherlands, the issuing of any necessary visas as expeditiously as possible and, where the legislation of the Kingdom of the Netherlands permits, the issuing of such visas free of charge.

3) The Government shall facilitate customs formalities for those persons on entering and leaving the Kingdom of the Netherlands.

4) The Government shall make available to the Agency, without charge, and for the entire duration of the meeting, premises and facilities adequate and appropriate for the meeting, as specified in the attached notes. Simultaneous interpretation facilities will be required for English, French, Spanish and Russian. The Agency will provide the interpreters.

5) The Government shall exercise reasonable care to ensure security on the premises in which the meeting takes place and to ensure the safety of the officials of the Agency and participants while on the premises of the meeting. The Government shall take whatever steps may be reasonable in the circumstances to ensure such security and such safety, including such supervision of the premises as may be warranted.

The Agency shall inform the Government of the Kingdom of the Netherlands promptly of all persons officially designated to attend the meeting. The Agency shall also inform such persons to apply for visas, if necessary, not later than two weeks before the opening date of the meeting. The Agency shall meet the costs of such persons for attending the meeting.

Should your Government wish to host the meeting in question, I should appreciate to receive in writing your Government's agreement on the above enumerated points as soon as possible.
