INTERNATIONAL ATOMIC ENERGY AGENCY

October 11, 1984

Sir,

I have the honour to inform you that the International Atomic Energy Agency will convene an Advisory Group meeting on "Radiation Technologies for Food Irradiation", at Wageningen, the Netherlands, November 12-15, 1984. The purpose of the meeting is to review the status of radiation engineering and development of concepts for the design of food irradiation facilities. It is also expected to provide recommendations for future activities of the Agency in this important field of industrial applications of ionizing radiations. Participants are expected from Belgium, Canada, Chile, France, Hungary, Israel, the Netherlands, Spain, UK, USA and USSR. The meeting will be held in English.

I have the honour to enquire if your Government would be prepared to host the meeting in question, in which event your Government would be expected to make the following arrangements:

1. With regard to the meeting the Agreement on the Privileges and Immunities of the IAEA of 1st July 1959 shall apply.

2. The Government of the Netherlands shall grant free of charge visas and necessary facilities to the participants of the meeting.

3. The Government of the Netherlands shall exercise all reasonable care to ensure security on the premises in which the meeting takes place and to ensure the safety of the officials of the Agency and participants concerned while on such premises. The Government shall take whatever steps may be reasonably required in the circumstances to ensure such security and such safety, including such supervision of the premises as may be warranted.

4. The Government shall make available to the Agency, without charge, and for the entire duration of the meeting, premises and facilities adequate and appropriate for the meeting.

Mr. V. Markovic of the Division of Research and Laboratories, who will be the Agency's Scientific Secretary for this meeting, has discussed this matter with Dr. J. Farkas from the International Facility for Food Irradiation Technology at Wageningen, who has, on an informal basis, indicated his willingness to assist us in holding this meeting at his Institute.

Should your Government wish to host the meeting in question, I would appreciate receiving in writing your Government's agreement on the above enumerated points as soon as possible so as to enable the Secretariat to proceed with timely arrangements.

Accept, Sir, the assurances of my highest consideration.

D. PARLEMENT

De in de brieven vervatte overeenkomst behoeft ingevolge additioneel artikel XXI, eerste lid, onderdeel b, van de Grondwet, juncto artikel 62, eerste lid, onderdeel c, van de Grondwet naar de tekst van 1972, niet de goedkeuring van de Staten-Generaal.

G. INWERKINGTREDING

De bepalingen van de in de brieven vervatte overeenkomst zijn op 15 oktober 1984 in werking getreden.

Wat het Koninkrijk der Nederlanden betreft, geldt de overeenkomst alleen voor Nederland.

J. GEGEVENS

Van het op 26 oktober 1956 te New York tot stand gekomen Statuut van de Internationale Organisatie voor Atoomenergie (IAEA), met Bijlage, zijn tekst en vertaling geplaatst in *Trb.* 1957, 50; zie ook, laatstelijk, *Trb.* 1973, 103.

Van de op 1 juli 1959 te Wenen tot stand gekomen Overeenkomst inzake de voorrechten en immuniteiten van de Internationale Organisatie voor Atoomenergie, naar welke Overeenkomst in brief Nr. I wordt verwezen, is de Engelse tekst geplaatst in *Trb.* 1965, 49; zie ook *Trb.* 1971, 57.

In overeenstemming met artikel 5, tweede zin, van de Rijkswet van 22 juni 1961 (*Stb.* 207) houdende regeling inzake de bekendmaking van internationale overeenkomsten en van besluiten van volkenrechtelijke organisaties, heeft de Minister van Buitenlandse Zaken bepaald dat de bekendmakingstermijn van dertig dagen wat betreft de in de brieven vervatte overeenkomst wordt gewijzigd en dat de tekst van de in de brieven vervatte overeenkomst op de datum van uitgifte in Nederland is bekendgemaakt.
