Sir,

I have the honour to inform you that the Secretariat of the International Atomic Energy Agency is planning to hold the third and final research co-ordination meeting for participants in the Co-ordinated Research Programme on the "Significance of hair mineral analysis as a means for assessing internal body burdens of environmental pollutants" from 6-9 July 1987.

The objective of the meeting is to discuss and evaluate the results obtained during the programme, and to seek ways by which the knowledge from this programme can be beneficially applied. The duration of the meeting will be four days, and approximately eleven scientists from Bulgaria, China, Czechoslovakia, Federal Republic of

Germany, Hungary, Japan, the Netherlands, and the United States of America, as well as from the IAEA are expected to attend the meeting (see attached list¹⁾).

I have the honour to enquire whether your Government would wish to host the meeting in question, in which event the Government would be expected to make the following arrangements:

1. With regard to the meeting the Agreement on the Privileges and Immunities of the IAEA of 1st July 1959 shall apply.

2. The Government of the Netherlands shall grant free of charge visas and necessary facilities to the participants of the meeting.

3. The Government of the Netherlands shall exercise all reasonable care to ensure security on the premises in which the meeting takes place and to ensure the safety of the officials of the Agency and participants concerned while on such premises. The Government shall take whatever steps may be reasonably required in the circumstances to ensure such security and such safety, including such supervision of the premises as may be warranted.

4. The Government shall make available to the Agency, without charge, and for the entire duration of the meeting, premises and facilities adequate and appropriate for the meeting. These will include a meeting room to accommodate up to 15 persons, a slide projector, an overhead projector and document reproduction facilities. No interpretation will be required.

The Agency shall inform the persons officially designated to attend the meeting to apply for visas, if necessary, in good time before the opening date of the meeting, and the Government is expected to issue such visas promptly so as to allow participants to attend the meeting.

Mr. E. Cortes-Toro of the Division of Life Sciences, who is Project Officer for the Programme and the Scientific Secretary of the meeting, has discussed the matter informally with Dr. R. D. Vis, Vrije Universiteit, De Boelelaan 1105, 1081 HV Amsterdam, (Tel: 020-5483501); the latter has already expressed his willingness to assist the Agency in making arrangements for the meeting.

Should your Government wish to host the meeting in question, I should appreciate receiving in writing your Government's agreement

on the above enumerated points as soon as possible so as to enable the Secretariat to proceed with timely arrangements.
