Sir,

I have the honour to inform you that the Secretariat of the International Atomic Energy Agency is planning to hold a Specialists' Meeting on "Probabilistic Reliability Analysis and Experience in Instrumentation and Control as a Decision Tool" in September/October 1990.

The purpose of the meeting is to review the experience and research carried out on the subject, which was given considerable attention at the last meeting of the IAEA International Working Group on Nuclear Power Plant Control and Instrumentation (IWG-NPPCI) held from 8 to 10 May 1989, Vienna, due to its importance for the safe operation of nuclear power plants.

The duration of the meeting will be three days. Participants from 26 Member States and 3 organizations as listed in the Annex, are expected to attend the meeting. The working language of the meeting will be English and no interpretation will be provided.

I have the honour to enquire whether your Government would wish to host the meeting in question, in which event the Government would be expected to make the following arrangements:

1. With regard to the meeting the Agreement on the Privileges and Immunities of the IAEA of 1st July 1959 shall apply.
2. The Government of the Netherlands will grant free of charge visas and necessary facilities to the participants of the meeting.
3. The Government of the Netherlands will exercise all reasonable care to ensure security on the premises in which the meeting takes place and to ensure the safety of the officials of the Agency and participants concerned while on such premises. The Government will take whatever steps that may be reasonably required in the circumstances to ensure such security and such safety, including such supervision of the premises as may be warranted.
4. The Government will make available to the Agency, without charge, and for the entire duration of the meeting, premises and facilities adequate and appropriate for the meeting.

The Agency will inform the Government promptly of all persons officially designated to attend the meeting. The Agency will also advise such persons to apply for visas, if necessary, in good time before the opening date of the meeting, and the Government is expected to issue such visas promptly so as to allow participants to attend the meeting.

The national representative of the Netherlands to the IWG-NPPCI, Mr. Y. van der Plas, Nuclear Department, Ministry of Social Affairs and Employment/KFD, P.O. Box 69, 2270 MA Voorburg (Tel.: 070-624611 and 070-694001), at the last meeting of this Group suggested to hold a meeting on the above-mentioned subject in the Netherlands. This suggestion met unanimous support because of the evident benefit of such meeting for researchers both in your country and abroad.

Should your Government wish to host the meeting in question, I should appreciate receiving in writing your Government's agreement on the above enumerated points by 1 January 1990, so as to enable the Secretariat to proceed with timely arrangements.
