B. TEKST

DIE 43/RAK/Wied-2/1-91 (18)

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs presents its compliments to the Royal Netherlands Embassy and has the honour to remind that from 28 May to 7 June 1991 the Symposium on the Cultural Heritage of the CSCE participating States will take place in Cracow, Poland.

In order to secure appropriate conditions for the work of the Symposium, the Government of the Republic of Poland has decided that all participants of the Symposium and the members of personnel of the Executive Secretariat shall enjoy the privileges and immunities provided by the United Nations Convention of 1969 on Special Missions. This legal status shall apply to all participants for the duration of the Symposium and to the Executive Secretariat, and its staff, regardless of their nationality, as long as the Secretariat is in function in Poland.

Provided that the above is acceptable, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs has the honour to suggest that this note and the Embassy's positive answer are to be regarded as an agreement between the two Governments.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs avails itself of this opportunity to

renew to the Royal Netherlands Embassy the assurances of its highest consideration.

The Royal Netherlands Embassy presents its compliments to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Poland with reference to its Note DIE 43/RAK/Wied-2/1-91 (18) has the honour to inform the Ministry as follows.

Regardless of the fact that the Kingdom of the Netherlands is not a party to the UN-Convention on Special Missions, 8 December, 1969, it is acceptable to the Netherlands Government that the privileges and immunities of this Convention, shall apply to all participants for the duration of the Symposium, and to the Executive Secretariat and its staff, regardless of their nationality, as long as the Secretariat is in function in Poland.

The Netherlands Government considers the above-mentioned Note and this reply as an agreement between the Kingdom of the Netherlands and the Republic of Poland, which shall remain in force for the duration of the Symposium.

The Royal Netherlands Embassy avails itself of this opportunity to renew to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Poland the assurances of its highest consideration.

D. PARLEMENT

De in de nota's vervatte overeenkomst behoeft ingevolge artikel 91, juncto additioneel artikel XXI, eerste lid, onderdeel b, van de Grondwet en juncto artikel 62, eerste lid, onderdeel c, van de Grondwet naar de tekst van 1972, niet de goedkeuring van de Staten-Generaal.

G. INWERKINGTREDING

De bepalingen van de in de nota's vervatte overeenkomst zijn op 20 november 1991 in werking getreden, maar golden ingevolge de derde alinea van brief Nr. II voor de duur van het Symposium.

Wat het Koninkrijk der Nederlanden betreft, gold de overeenkomst alleen voor Nederland.

Van de bij Resolutie 2530 (XXIV) van 8 december 1969 door de Algemene Vergadering der Verenigde Naties aangenomen en op 16 december 1969 te New York voor ondertekening opengestelde Overeenkomst inzake speciale missies, met facultatief protocol betreffende de verplichte regeling van geschillen, naar welke Overeenkomst in de onderhavige overeenkomst wordt verwezen, is de tekst geplaatst in Bijlage 93 van Uitgave nr. 96 van het Ministerie van Buitenlandse Zaken getiteld „Verslag van de 24ste zitting van de Algemene Vergadering der Verenigde Naties; september-december 1969.”
